Holy Land, the plight of Jews and Muslims in Spain in 1492, and the genocide of the indigenous peoples of both North and South America, the latter of which smacks of a Christianity "spread by the sword." The focus of Christian hostility and belligerence is not confined to just "infidels" but has often been directed towards other Christians over both religious and secular issues: The Thirty Years' War (1618-1648), various European wars for gaining power and/or territory, the French Revolution, the American Revolution, World War I, and World War II, etc. The latter two wars are actually misnomers, because they were mainly wars between Christian nations (with the exception of Japan) over wealth and territory. Moroccans were not fighting the Spanish. The Cubans were not fighting the Haitians. Neither the Sudanese were fighting the Egyptians, nor the Iranians the Afghanis, nor the Panamanians the Colombians. To be fair, Christians should really reflect on the real numbers of innocent civilians killed during their wars against themselves and others when contemplating issues of human rights abuses.

Women's issues is yet another paradoxical subject with respect to their scriptures, but nevertheless a favorite topic of Christians nowadays when attacking other religions. How can television evangelist Joyce Meyer reconcile the following verses of the New Testament with her ministry?

Let your women keep silence in the churches: for it is not permitted unto them to speak; but they are commanded to be under obedience, as also saith the law.

(1 Corinthians 14:34-35)

Let the woman learn in silence with all subjection.

But I suffer not a woman to teach, nor to usurp authority over the man, but to be in silence. For Adam was first formed, then Eve.

And Adam was not deceived, but the woman being deceived was in the transgression. (1 Timothy 2:11-14)

But every woman that prayeth or prophesieth with her head uncovered dishonoureth her head: for that is even all one as if she were shaven. (1 Corinthians 11:5)

In like manner also, that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety; not with broided hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array;

But (which becometh women professing godliness) with good works. (1 Timothy 2:9-10)

To be honest, we have to say that most, if not all, Christian churches have devolved into social groups embracing secular humanism with just a taint of religion, in which the tradition of common liturgy, hymns, and a handful of allegories from the Bible are the primary cohesive forces rather than real creed or belief. The outward slogan is to "save souls," but the covert agenda is to market a western consumer lifestyle, complete with acceptable linguistic norms, politically correct topics of discussion (homosexuality is OK to discuss, but never talk about economic and military aid to Israel or mention the word "Zionism" without being ostracized), and official dress codes that all work in unison against pluralism, multiculturalism, or any basic right to *really* practice any non-Christian religion. One can gain employment as a homosexual or atheist, but not as a practicing Orthodox Jew or Orthodox Muslim, because their dress codes and dietary laws do not conform to our "Christian" society. Keep in mind, most Ultra-Orthodox Jews vehemently oppose the current State of Israel.

God's True Message to All Mankind

Now that modern-day "Christianity" has been outed and its true colors have been exposed, let us look deeper into the obvious message from the One God, our Creator, in the Bible that pastors have purposely concealed. That message is who God really is, and who He chose as His final Messenger.

And the Lord said unto me, they have well spoken that which they have spoken, I will raise them up a Prophet from among their brethren, like unto thee, and will put my words in his mouth; and he shall speak unto them all that I shall command him. (Deuteronomy 18:17-18)
